COMMUNIQUE

of the

National Caucus Meeting of the PRP held at Code Seminar and Training
Centre, 6 Rabah Close, off Rabah Road, Malali Kaduna on 12th July, 2018

1. The National Caucus of the People's Redemption Party (PRP) convened a one-day meeting at Code Seminar and Training Centre, Rabah Close, Off Rabah Road, Malali, Kaduna on 12th July, 2018.
2. The Meeting was attended by 16 National Leaders of the party drawn from across the Nigeria Federation under the Chairmanship of the National Chairman of the People's Redemption Party, Alhaji Abdulkadir Balarabe Musa.
3. The Meeting reviewed the current state of the nation and the place and role of the Party in the context of the ongoing political dynamics in the country.
4. The meeting noted the recent emergence of a number of political alliances in Nigeria's political firmament, particularly the emergence of the PDP-led coalition of 35 political parties under the name of Coalition of United Political Parties (CUPP).
5. The meeting observed that the CUPP coalition is unworkable because it does not offer a qualitative and credible alternative to the existing political order.

6. The meeting further re-affirmed the commitment and resolve of the PRP to continue to maintain its separate identify as a party and its sacred goal of reconstructing the social and economic structure of the nation along the lines of Equity, Justice, Fair play and even development.

The meeting re-affirmed the PRP's principled commitment to political and electoral alliance with other like-minded political parties on the basis of a minimum common programme that can further consolidate national unity and ensure a conducive atmosphere for free and fair elections that would guarantee the emergence of legitimate governments at the Federal, State, and Local Government Levels.
8. The meeting further clarified the PRP's position that in rejecting and dismissing the PDP-led CUPP coalition as unworkable and ineffectual, the party is by no means lending support to the ruling APC which has failed to measure up to the basic expectations of Nigerians.
9. The meeting re-affirmed the PRP's open-door policy to all patriotic, progressive and principled political parties and political activists genuinely interested in working together to move Nigeria forward.
